Notes on The Rapture

The **<u>Appearing</u>** [parousia] of our Lord (I John 3:2) refers to the <u>**Rapture**</u>. Whenever the name of our Lord is used such as the **Day of the Lord Jesus**, the **Day of Christ**, the **Day of the Lord Jesus Christ**, etc. it is always a reference to the <u>Rapture</u> and is a time of joy for God's children who are meeting Him in the air. We believe that only God's children will actually see Him at the Rapture.

The **Second Coming** of our Lord refers to Armageddon when our Lord returns with us to reign upon this present earth for 1000 years at the end of Israel's last seven years. Whenever the day is referred to as the **Day of the Lord**, or the **Day of God**, (and does not include Jesus' name) it always refers to the day of Armageddon and is a time of darkness and destruction of ungodly men. At the Second Coming – every eye shall see Him.
