While it is true the Septuagint adds "recovery of sight to the blind" which not in Isaiah 61:1 it also leaves out to "set at liberty those who are bruised" which is! So the difference in the Greek is just as great as the Hebrew. Jesus in His reading includes part of Is. 35:5-6 in His reading which deals with the same subject, a practice which is not uncommon even today.

No Jewish synagogue would allow a Greek text to take the place of their beloved Hebrew.
